

Student Class Types Guide



CMC has five modalities, or class types. Choose the types of classes that work best for you and your learning style. Use this guide to identify class types in Student Planning.

In Student Planning, search for courses. Use *Filter Results* on the left side of the page to narrow the list of courses by availability, subjects, locations, and terms.

Classroom

Attend class in-person at scheduled times at a CMC campus or location.

To find Classroom courses in Student Planning, filter the results by the specific campus location where you want to take courses. Classroom courses display the days and times the course meets, start and end dates of the semester, campus location, building, and classroom number:

the 3 letters and 4 numbers specify the subject and course number

the 2 letters and 2 numbers are the campus location code and section number

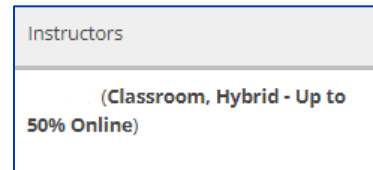
When you click on the blue text that includes the course code (CMC-1234-AA00 in the example above), you will see the complete section information. Under “Additional Information,” you’ll see the extended definition of **Classroom** courses: *Students experience instruction through in-person scheduled class meetings. Students are expected to be physically present at a designated CMC campus or location at specified dates and times. In addition, this course uses CMC’s learning management system to share the syllabus and other course materials.*

Hybrid

Attend class in-person at scheduled times and experience remote or online instruction. The percentage of in-person and remote or online instruction varies by course.

You should have a computer with internet access and computer skills to enroll in a Hybrid course.

To find Hybrid courses in Student Planning, filter the results by the specific campus location where you want to take courses. Hybrid courses look very similar to Classroom courses in Student Planning, but they will say “Hybrid” and display a percentage of Online content.



Under “Additional Information,” you’ll see the extended definition of **Hybrid** courses: *Students experience instruction through a combination of in-person scheduled class meetings and online instruction. Students are expected to be physically present at a designated CMC campus or location at specified dates and times. To be successful in this course, students must have access to a computer with a reliable internet connection as well as basic computer skills. In addition, this course uses CMC’s learning management system to share the syllabus and other course materials.*

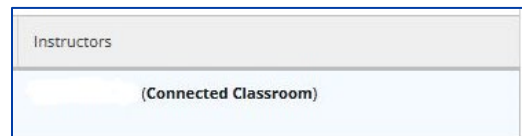


Connected Classroom

Attend class in-person and/or through a designated technology from a technology-enhanced CMC classroom at scheduled times.

The instructor may assign a specific way of attending the course (either in person or via a designated technology) for particular class meetings or for the entire semester. Because these courses may connect classrooms across multiple CMC campuses, it is possible that you will not be in the same classroom as your instructor. You should have a computer with internet access, a camera, speakers, and microphone, as well as computer skills, to enroll in a Connected Classroom course.

To find Connected Classroom courses in Student Planning, filter the results by the specific campus location where you want to take courses. Connected Classroom courses are described by the phrase “Connected Classroom.”



Under “Additional Information,” you’ll see the extended definition of **Connected Classroom** courses: *Students experience instruction through scheduled class meetings using technology-enhanced classrooms. Students are expected to be physically present at a designated CMC campus or location and/or connect through a designated technology, such as Zoom, at specified dates and times. In addition, this course uses CMC’s learning management system to share the syllabus and other course materials.*

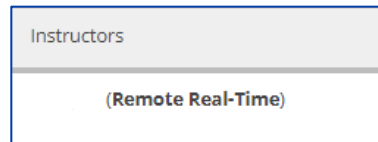


Remote Real-Time

Attend class using a designated technology at scheduled times.

You should have a computer with internet access, a camera, speakers, and microphone, as well as computer skills, to enroll in a Remote Real-Time course.

To find Remote Real-Time courses, filter the results by clicking Distance/Learning Collegewide. Remote Real-Time courses are described by the phrase “Remote Real-Time.”



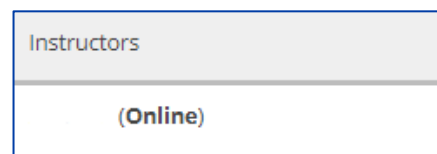
Under “Additional Information,” you’ll see the extended definition of **Remote Real-Time** courses: *Students experience instruction through scheduled class meetings using technology. Students can access class meetings from anywhere but are expected to attend using a designated technology, such as Zoom, at specified dates and times. Some sections may specify an in-person option at a specific campus in addition to the remote option. To be successful in this course, students must have access to a computer with a reliable internet connection, camera, speakers and a microphone. Students should also have basic computer skills. In addition, this course uses CMC’s learning management system to share the syllabus and other course materials.*



Experience the class online. Follow the schedule of course work with due dates and times.

Online courses allow self-motivated students learn on their own time. However, these courses still have start and end dates and a schedule of course work with due dates and times. You should have a computer with internet access and computer skills to enroll in an Online course.

To find Online courses, filter the results by clicking Distance/Learning Collegewide. Online courses will display the start and end dates of the semester, but there will be no scheduled class meeting times or locations. Online courses are described by the phrase “Online.”



Under “Additional Information,” you’ll see the extended definition of **Online** courses: *Students experience instruction online using CMC’s learning management system. The course is available between specified start and end dates. There are no scheduled class meetings, but students are expected to complete course work by specified dates and times. To be successful in this course, students must have access to a computer with a reliable internet connection as well as basic computer skills.*
