# WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CREDIT & COMMUNITY EDUCATION CLASSES?

**CREDIT CLASSES** count towards earning a college degree or certificate. Students must apply to CMC before registering for credit classes.

#### **COMMUNITY EDUCATION**

**CLASSES** are short-term and intended for enrichment and lifelong learning. Anyone may register for these community-led classes (some age restrictions apply). Also known as non-credit classes.

#### REGISTRATION

Please register as early as possible for classes that interest you. Each class has both a minimum and maximum number of students who may enroll. To secure your spot in classes, it's best to register early!

# **CLASS REGISTRATION**

**CURRENT STUDENTS:** If you have taken credit classes in the past 10 months, you may register in person or online at **Basecamp.ColoradoMtn.edu** 

**NEW OR RETURNING STUDENTS:** If you are new to CMC or have not taken credit classes in the past 10 months, you will need to complete an online application for admission. Visit ColoradoMtn.edu/register to get started.

**ACADEMIC ADVISING:** All students, including degree, certificate, and career-seekers, are strongly encouraged to make an appointment with a college counselor or Academic Advisor.

**TUITION:** Tuition rates per credit hour are as follows: \$100 (in-district residents); \$200 (in-state residents); and \$510 (out-of-state residents). Some programs have higher tuition rates. For more information about your tuition classification, visit ColoradoMtn.edu/Tuition. Military/Veterans, citizens aged 62 and over, and second homeowners within CMC's district may qualify for reduced tuition rates.

**PAYMENT FOR CREDIT CLASSES:** Registrations prior to November 12: payment and/or payment arrangements are due before midnight on December 18. For registrations made after November 12: payment and/or payment arrangements are DUE BEFORE MIDNIGHT THE DAY FOLLOWING REGISTRATION.

**TECHNOLOGY FEES:** Students pay a technology fee every semester based upon their credit load with a maximum of \$50/semester.

**DROPS & REFUNDS:** Log into Basecamp and drop online or fill out a Registration Add/Drop form and submit it to the campus. To receive a refund, the class must be dropped by the listed refund date in the syllabus. Students who drop classes after the refund date will not receive a refund.

**TEXTBOOKS:** The Learning Materials Program (LMP) is a flat rate library-like system that applies to all required course materials based on the number of credit hours (\$25/credit hour). See **ColoradoMtn.edu/Textbooks** for more info.



#### **GLAZING TECHNIQUES**

This class is recommended for individuals with prior clay experience who already feel comfortable either on the wheel and/or hand building. Students will initially build a small body of work which will be used to test different glazing techniques throughout the class, and there will be time allotted for building an ongoing/larger body of work throughout the classes. Demos will cover using glaze chips, bubbles, tape, latex wax, shaving cream, and newspaper transfers in the glaze application as well as sgraffito and mishima. The classes will also explore applying glazes by dipping, brushing, sponging, trailing, spraying, and splattering. Demonstrations will be focused on glazing rather than throwing and construction. Information about basic glaze chemistry and glaze recipes will also be provided.


## NEW PROGRAM

#### RADIOLOGY TECHNOLOGY

Have you ever wished you could have x-ray vision? While Colorado Mountain College can't promise superpowers, we can help give students a bright future with an in-demand career with our new Associate of Applied Science Degree in Radiological Technology.

Students who complete the program will be eligible to take exams from the American

Registry of Radiologic Technologists and get certified in radiography.



The program will combine in-classroom learning and practice, as well as internships and clinical hours in healthcare settings.

The new program was developed after surveying several community partners, including St. Vincent's Hospital in Leadville, UC Health Yampa Medical Center in Steamboat Springs, Valley View Hospital in Glenwood Springs, Vail Health in Vail and Dillon, Grand River Hospital in Rifle, Aspen Valley Hospital in Aspen and Centura Health. All reported that Radiologic Technologists are needed to address current staffing challenges. Nationwide, jobs for the area have grown by 7.4%. Radiologic Technologists and Technicians can earn \$79,332, while MRI Technologists, which would require additional training and certifications, can earn \$91,724.

The new program will be housed at the Vail Valley at Edwards campus. We expect the program to begin in the Fall of 2024.

# FACULTY SPOTLIGHT

#### SAMANTHA STEWART

Samantha Stewart is definitely the person you want by your side in a medical emergency. She will distract you with her humor and energy and before you know it, she'll have the scene under control and you feeling like you have a friend during the scary stuff.

Sam joined Colorado Mountain College in August as our EMT Emergency Medical



Technician) Basic faculty. But, she is not new to Colorado. She grew up in Paonia, then went to Colorado State University for a degree in Social Work, with a minor in Sociology. Then, she got her EMT certificate from Denver Health and "ran away" to the beach in South Carolina. There, she worked as an EMT and Paramedic, as well as a Flight Paramedic. She was looking for ways to return to Colorado and make Emergency Medical Services a life-long career when the opportunity at CMC came up.

"It was the perfect storm," Sam said. "I love being a paramedic, but I decided that home wasn't so bad after all, and wanted to live closer to home. This was the perfect opportunity. I want to build a career here."

One of her most vivid memories from her time in South Carolina was being in a medical helicopter as it was landing on an interstate late at night, seeing headlights and taillights stopped on the road for miles.

"I just remember thinking about all of those people watching us land," Sam explained. "It was pretty wild to think of how far I've come from tiny little Paonia to this intense accident on an Interstate in the middle of South Carolina."

Sam is a great fit for the EMS life, and for being a faculty, helping the next generation learn the skills necessary to run their own scenes.

"I'm bossy and I like being in charge," Sam joked. "I like running my own scene. And, I love how excited all of my students are. It's a profession and a career I'm excited about, and I get to have 15 people as excited as I am in class every single day."

She is convinced that more people would be a good fit for the profession than think that they are.

"I think a lot of people could do the job, as long as they are open minded and up for the challenge," Sam said. "I'll teach you all of the tools. You can do this! Just do the work and learn the information. Learn to use your 'I mean it' voice. That's really half the battle. I think people would be surprised. It sounds scarier and more intimidating than it is in practice."

While the back of an ambulance is her favorite place to be, Sam is also mindful about having a good balance in her life. When she's not in the classroom, she likes to run, eat healthy, walk her dogs and go home to Paonia.

Clayton lived in the Eagle River Valley for most of his life, though he was born in California and currently lives in Battlement Mesa with his wife and three children.



"That internship program was the main reason for me wanting to do this for a career," Clayton explained. "I have never had a job that was more rewarding than teaching and working with students."

Clayton keeps up on trends in the automotive and mechanics industry, and enjoys working with vendors so he understands the evolution of the industry and can teach his students how to adapt to new technologies.



# STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

#### URMILA TIMILSINA

We're often told to not let opportunities pass us by. CMC Medical Assisting student Urmila Timilsina not only doesn't let opportunities pass her by, she also seeks out new opportunities, and creates her own opportunities. She is determined to grow and change, and meet challenges head on, all in the name of creating a better life for her and her family.

"I am from Nepal, and moved to the United States in 2010, and my life completely changed.



Everything was new and I had to learn to adapt," Urmila said. "I had to create a whole new life for myself, and that taught me to always look for opportunities."

Urmila settled in Dallas, Texas after arriving in the US, and spoke no English. So, she applied herself and learned English, and earned her license in Cosmetology. She got married in 2013, and shortly after they wed, her husband had a good job opportunity at the Ritz Carlton in Vail. They thought they would try it for a year and move somewhere else, but they fell in love with the valley and the mountains, so they bought a home and started a family.

She started at Colorado Mountain College in 2017, but paused her studies to stay home with her two children. With both children now old enough to be in school, Urmila saw the opportunity to return to school.

"I know I want to go into the nursing field," Urmila said. "Right now, I'm studying Medical Assisting, but want to earn my Registered Nurse degree so I can help people. I enjoy helping people."

Urmila was on campus for a class when she saw a flyer for the TRIO program, and seized on the opportunity to get the additional support TRIO offers, and then took the opportunity to work with TRIO to help other students. She is now a Student Mentor for TRIO on the Vail Valley campus, helping other students learn how to balance work and school.

"I am a full-time mom and a full-time student, and it is hard. It's very challenging," Urmila said. "I try to study in the morning before the children are awake, and then study after they go to sleep at night. My husband supports me and my kids understand. You just have to figure out how to manage your time."

Urmila plans to graduate in the Fall of 2024 with her Medical Assisting degree, and will then apply to the Nursing program.

When she's not at school, Urmila and her family enjoy cooking, hiking, cycling, and finding the best parks in Eagle County.

"We like to make memories," Urmila said.


