WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CREDIT & COMMUNITY EDUCATION CLASSES?

CREDIT CLASSES count towards earning a college degree or certificate. Students must apply to CMC before registering for credit classes.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

CLASSES are short-term and intended for enrichment and lifelong learning. Anyone may register for these community-led classes (some age restrictions apply). Also known as non-credit classes.

REGISTRATION

Please register as early as possible for classes that interest you. Each class has both a minimum and maximum number of students who may enroll. To secure your spot in classes, it's best to register early!



Candy Laven had some burning questions about her ancestors. She enrolled in the Getting Started class with David Use. She says, "I had searched for information for years with no success until David directed me to new resources that weren't obvious to me.

"For years, my family wondered if my mother's step-sister might have been a half-sister instead because of a strong resemblance. In David's class, we examined the DNA markers which confirmed she indeed was a step-sister.

"I had always heard my second great grandfather, stationed in Turkey with the English military, died of the Bubonic Plague, along with his wife, on a ship. It was rumored their two children were separated, and one was raised in an orphanage. In searching court records in David's class, we found that both parents actually died in Constantinople days apart. Census records revealed their children were sent together to live with their aunt in Liverpool."



Do you have all your ducks in a row?

Lisa Runck, a Roaring Fork Valley bird enthusiast, took CMC's Birding for Beginners class to expand her knowledge. She explains, "I was surprised to learn that the shadows of what I thought were simply ducks were actually three different types of ducks – Northern Shoveler (pictured above), Gadwall, and Mallard – all with distinctive features if you stopped to take a closer look." 
