Dear Prospective Dental Hygiene Student:

Thank you for your interest in the Dental Hygiene Program at Colorado Mountain College (CMC). This program culminates in an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) Degree in Dental Hygiene, also referred to as the Associate Degree in Dental Hygiene.

Students of this program are eligible to apply to take the written National Board Dental Hygiene Exam (NBDHE) and the Central Regional Dental Testing Services, (CRDTS) clinical licensure test, two requirements to obtain their RDH license in the state in which the student chooses to practice. The Associate Degree of Dental Hygiene at Colorado Mountain College is accredited by the [Commission on Dental Accreditation](#) (CODA), 211 E. Chicago Avenue, Chicago, IL 60611, (312) 440-2940.

This packet is designed to provide information and guide you through the process of applying to the in-person, Dental Hygiene Program *only* at the CMC, Vail Valley at Edwards campus.

Applicants must meet specific requirements. Admission to the CMC Dental Hygiene Program is a competitive process. All applicants are strongly encouraged to work with a CMC academic advisor/college counselor to receive information regarding general education courses to prepare for entrance to the program and connect you with a variety of resources. The CMC academic advisor/college counselor links are listed on page 7 of this packet.

Please pay close attention to the deadlines and details noted throughout the application to enhance your opportunity for success with the application process. The application for admission and supporting documents must be submitted electronically no later than **December 15, 2024**. Transcripts from other colleges and universities must be submitted to CMC by **November 1, 2024**. You must also submit a CMC [general application](#), to access the dental hygiene application. Additional transcripts will not be evaluated without a general CMC application on file. Please take this step as soon as possible.

All Dental Hygiene applications are submitted electronically via CMC's application system.

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Suggestions For Using This Packet

Suggestions for using this packet and completing the CMC Dental Hygiene Program application:

1. Review all pages of the application thoroughly; note any questions you may have.
2. If you are a new student, you will need to complete and submit a CMC [general application](#) online.
3. Make an appointment with an academic advisor/college counselor (listed on page 7) to discuss the following:
 - Your interest and compatibility with a dental hygiene career and program requirements.
 - Your academic preparedness to meet the English, math and reading requirements.
 - Information about support services available for students with disabilities, if applicable.
 - A plan and timeline for completion of general education courses and/or any courses you plan to transfer to CMC. Transcripts must be received by November 1, 2024 (earlier is appreciated) for evaluation before the December 15, 2024 deadline.
 - Complete and submit an online CMC general application prior to submitting your transcripts for evaluation. *Transcripts will not be evaluated without a CMC general application.* If you are a current student, you do not need to fill out a CMC application. If you have not taken a course with CMC in the last year, then a new application will be needed.
 - Your need for financial assistance as a pre-dental hygiene and dental hygiene student and the financial aid application process and any scholarships (CMC [financial aid specialists](#) are available to assist you).
 - The academic rigor of the dental hygiene program, including the commitment and time, successful students must put into the program once they are accepted.
 - The appropriate year to apply to the dental hygiene program.
4. If applying for the 2025-26 academic year:
 - Review and complete requirements listed in this application.
 - Have all official transcripts from your institution sent to the Registrar's Office by November 1, 2024. It is preferred they are sent electronically to registrar@coloradomtn.edu.
 - Attend a Dental Hygiene Information Session (required for application), dates and details provided on the [Dental Hygiene Program](#) page.
 - Schedule your TEAS exam on-line. Please follow the directions as outlined on page 8 of this application. Test dates prior to April 1, 2024 will not be accepted. Make sure you upload a copy of your scores with your application.
 - Schedule your Casper online test and request to have scores sent to CMC. Please follow the directions as outlined on page 9 of this application. Test dates prior to April 1, 2024 will not be accepted.
 - Create and compile your application.
 - Upload your completed application by 11:59 pm on December 15, 2024.

Summer 2025 Dental Hygiene Program Admission Application Process

Applicants who meet the criteria as outlined in the application process will be considered for admission to the CMC Dental Hygiene Program. In the review, applicants' grades in the pre-requisite and general education courses, degrees, residency status, and alternate status in the previous year are awarded points. The "Dental Hygiene Application Check List," included on page 15-16 of this packet provides a list of all documents to be submitted to complete the application process.

1. A new CMC Application for Admission is required for all new applicants, or a student who has not taken a CMC course within the last year. Students currently taking courses with CMC do not need to provide a new application. The CMC [general application](#) is available online.
2. The supplemental dental hygiene application will be completed and submitted online using CMC's application system. You can access the supplemental dental hygiene application through your CMC [admissions account](#), which you originally used to apply to CMC. If you have not yet created a CMC admissions account, please complete step one above.
Once in your admissions account, you will select "Create a New Application". Then choose Dental Hygiene as your Student Type and answer the questions that populate to access the application. Please make sure you read the requirements and questions carefully.
3. Applicants must submit official transcript(s) for college credits completed. A CMC Application for Admission must be completed prior to having transcripts sent in. You can fill out a CMC application online. *The Admissions Office will automatically generate CMC transcripts and current schedules for applicants.* Please do not request your CMC transcripts to be sent to Admissions.
4. Applicants must hold a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.4 or higher on a 4.0 scale. Nearly all successful applicants admitted to the Dental Hygiene Program have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above.
5. The Dental Hygiene Program general admission requirements listed below are not required to be completed to apply for the Dental Hygiene Program; however, they must be completed prior to starting the Dental Hygiene Program classes in the summer. Most students admitted to the program have completed most, if not all, of these general education courses at the time of application to the program. A grade of "C" or higher (not C-) is required in general education and dental hygiene courses.
 - BIO 2101 Anatomy and Physiology I (min 4 credits, at CMC BIO 1111 is a pre/co-requisite)
 - BIO 2102 Anatomy and Physiology II (min 4 credits)
 - BIO 2104 Microbiology (min 4 credits)
 - Nutrition (min 3 credits, e.g. HWE 1050)
 - English Composition (min 3 credits, e.g. ENG 1021)
 - Communication (min 3 credits, e.g. COM 1150 or 1250)
 - Sociology (min 3 credits, e.g. SOC 1001 or higher)
 - Psychology (min 3 credits, e.g. PSY 1001 or higher)
 - Chemistry (min 4 credits, e.g. CHE 1011, CHE 1009 or higher)

Please include a current class schedule of courses in progress if not enrolled at CMC. Students with courses in progress may be offered a *Conditional Acceptance* pending successful completion of the courses. A Challenge Exam may be available for some general education courses. Please contact an academic advisor/college counselor for more information.

Students who plan to receive financial aid should know that they will not be considered at full-time status in the summer sessions. Discuss your financial aid needs and circumstances with a Financial Aid Specialist and/or an academic advisor/college counselor to determine your optimal plan for completion of the general education courses and dental hygiene courses once in the program.

6. Admitted applicants must have a current CPR Certification (must be American Heart Association Healthcare Provider Basic Life Support-BLS). Students are required to have this to start courses.
7. Applicants must submit a one-page chronological resume detailing education, related certifications, and work experience in chronological order.
8. Applicants with dental assisting or health care certifications and work experience will be awarded points during the application review process for current, active, dental or health-care related certificates plus work experience over six months using those dental or healthcare certifications.
9. Applicants must complete the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS), an online assessment provided through Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI). The TEAS test is specifically designed to assess applicants in the areas of Reading, Math, Science, and English as they relate to allied health education. No minimum TEAS score is required for admission into the program, but points are awarded for scores. Scores prior to April 1, 2024 will not be accepted for the 2025 application. The TEAS feedback will assist faculty and advisors in guiding students toward success in the program. See page 8 for details on taking the TEAS. Points are awarded based on your total composite score.
10. Applicants are also required to complete a mandatory online 90-minute computer-based assessment, Casper, as a component of the selection process. See pages 8-9 for details in taking the Casper test.
11. Students must attend a CMC Dental Hygiene Program Information Session prior to applying. The sessions are offered at least quarterly. This is not an interview, and it is not scored. The purpose is to assure the potential applicant is well advised about the rigors of the program and the process for licensure after graduation.
12. The Dental Hygiene Program application review process will recognize applicants who have been an alternate to the Dental Hygiene Program in the previous year by awarding points.
13. CMC is a community college deeply involved with and supported by our local communities. In an effort to support community students, all applicants who qualify for in-district tuition status at the time of their application will be awarded points in the application process.
14. Those accepted into the Dental Hygiene Program are expected to be computer literate and be able to actively email, word process, use Canvas, utilize Basecamp, and effectively research using the Internet and related electronic resources.

Admission requirements are reviewed annually and are subject to change. It is the student's responsibility to obtain a copy of the current year's admission packet to meet admission requirements.

Students who are not admitted for Summer 2025 must re-apply for a future entrance term. CMC does not maintain a wait list of past applicants from year-to-year.

The Dental Hygiene Program requires that all courses in the dental hygiene curriculum be completed at CMC; credit for prior learning, CMC challenge exams, or individual dental hygiene courses completed at another institution may not be used to fulfill dental hygiene (DEH) courses.

Application Process and Requirements

Transcript Submission Deadline and Transcript Evaluation Process

- Official Transcripts must be submitted to the CMC Registrar's Office by November 1, 2024, (earlier is appreciated!) to be evaluated for review with the applicant's file December 15, 2024.
- Official college transcripts must be sent directly to the Registrar's Office from all previous institutions for a formal transcript evaluation to determine what previous coursework will transfer to Colorado Mountain College.
- A new CMC application for general admission is required for all new applicants and any student who has not taken a course within the last year. Students currently taking courses with CMC do not need to provide a new application. The [application](#) is available online.

Application Deadline

- December 15, 2024, is the Dental Hygiene Application deadline.
- Only completed applications including the required supporting documents submitted by December 15, 2024 will be considered for acceptance into the Dental Hygiene Program. It is the applicant's responsibility to assure that all application materials are included. All application materials must be uploaded by 11:59 pm on December 15, 2024 to be considered for admission.

Transfer Credits/Course Substitutions

Applicants earn points for academic degrees they have earned, and general education courses as indicated above. Upon submitting official transcripts from an outside institution, the Registrar will determine transfer equivalencies at CMC where applicable. If you believe that a specific course should have been counted towards a prerequisite, please reach out to the Admissions Representative for Health Sciences Programs to discuss.

Required Assessments

All applicants applying to the Dental Hygiene Program at Colorado Mountain College are required to complete two online assessments, TEAS and Casper, to assist with the selection process.

TEAS Testing (Test of Essential Academic Skills)

Completing the TEAS testing for the Dental Hygiene Program:

- CMC utilizes the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS), an online assessment provided through Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI). The TEAS test is specifically designed to assess applicants in the areas of Reading, Math, Science and English as related to dental hygiene education. The test you will register for is ATI Remote Proctor –Allied Health.
- The TEAS score is used to award points for admission into the program.
- Several items are available to assist you in preparation for the test (study guides, online practice tests). You may purchase any or all items from [ATI](#). Pricing information can be found on ATI's website. Alternatively, CMC offers access for current students to some TEAS prep materials. Please visit the CMC [Libraries](#) website and select the *Learning Express* database from the A- Z Database list to access these materials.
- The TEAS test results must be from within the past 8 months from application deadline (December 15, 2024), using the most current version of the test. No scores prior to April 1, 2024 will be accepted for the 2025 application.
- More information for taking the TEAS is located on pages 16-17 of this application packet.

Casper Assessment (Computer-Based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics)

- The Computer-Based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics (Casper) is an online test which assesses non-cognitive skills and interpersonal characteristics that we believe are important for successful students and graduates of our program. Successful completion of the Casper is mandatory to maintain admission eligibility.
- The Casper score is used to award points to applicants for admission to the program. The Casper complements the other tools that we use for applicant screening.
- The Casper test is comprised of two response sections, including both written and video scenarios. The entire test is expected to take 90-110 minutes to complete. Each response is graded by a different rater, giving a very robust and reliable view of personal and professional characteristics important to our program.
- While students cannot necessarily study the content that will be on the Casper, they can prepare for the format of this exam. Please visit the [Casper](#) website for information about how to prepare.
- The applicant is responsible for securing access to a computer with audio capabilities, a webcam, and a reliable internet connection on the selected test date. The Casper can be taken practically anywhere so that these requirements can be satisfied. No exceptions will be provided for applicants unable to take

Casper online due to being located at sites where the internet is not dependable due to technical or political factors. Please ensure you have a quiet environment to take the test. If you have concerns about your testing environment, please contact the Admissions Representative for Health Sciences Programs Scott Schreiner at sschreiner@coloradomtn.edu.

- It is the applicant's responsibility to register online with Casper to reserve a spot on one of the available test dates. To register for the Casper, please visit the [Casper](#) website.
 - Register for the Dental Hygiene CSP-10106 – US Undergraduate Health Sciences test and reserve a test using a government issued photo ID.
 - Please note there is a fee associated with the Casper.
- There are a limited number of [testing dates and times](#) – please note these are the *only* testing dates available for the Casper test. There will be no additional dates scheduled. Please be aware of the times listed on their website.
- The dates will be posted on the [Casper](#) website. Please check the dates frequently, as they are subject to change.
- Our program does not require applicants to complete the Casper Snapshot for this admissions cycle.
- Casper results are valid for one admissions cycle. Applicants who have already taken the test in previous years will therefore be expected to retake it.
- Casper requires that you disable all extensions on your computer before taking the exam. Please ensure that you disable things such as Grammarly or other AI extensions prior to your test. If you do not disable the extensions, your score will be significantly affected.

Important Information for Those Accepted and Alternates

Notification of Acceptance

All applicants will receive an email notification of the status of their application in February. Those students who are conditionally accepted and those who are conditional alternates (offered a position if it becomes available) are expected to accept or decline their position in writing by returning the dated form enclosed with the acceptance/alternate notification letter. Failure to respond by the date indicated in the letter will result in forfeiture of acceptance. No exceptions will be made.

Orientation and Registration Details on the required Vail Valley at Edwards Orientation Session will be emailed to all applicants. See the [Vail Valley at Edwards](#) page for more information about the campus.

Scheduling and Work Recommendations

Due to the fast pace, challenging, and rigorous academic demands of the dental hygiene program, the dental hygiene faculty urge students to avoid work commitments while enrolled in the program for a variety of reasons. Clinical schedules are subject to last minute revisions each semester.

Students' personal commitments must remain flexible to meet course objectives and accommodate program requirements. Students are encouraged to pursue personal support and assistance such as financial aid, additional childcare, and back-up support to allow for a more flexible schedule.

Reliable transportation is needed due to the program being only offered at the Vail Valley at Edwards campus and experiential locations and events. A curriculum outline for the program is included with this packet.

Required Paperwork & Background Check

- Accepted students will receive a Health History and Immunization Form that must be completed by a medical care provider and submitted before they are considered accepted, and no longer have conditional status.
- Conditionally accepted students will be required to obtain and pass a criminal background investigation, FBI fingerprinting, and drug screening (approx. cost to the student is \$160.00). Accepted students will receive instructions for completing these screenings from the dental hygiene department.

Dental Hygiene Textbooks & Learning Materials

Getting all required textbooks is convenient and affordable through the CMC Textbook Learning Materials Program (LMP). The program fee is billed per credit hour and includes the costs of textbooks and course materials customized to your schedule. See the CMC [LMP](#) page to learn more.

Admission/Selection Information Sheet

Selection Criteria: Description

The Dental Hygiene Program uses an objective point system for selection. Points are awarded for the following:

Information Session: Although not scored, the applicant must attend a dental hygiene program information session prior to applying. Dates are visible on Basecamp, and the [Dental Hygiene](#) program page.

College GPA: Although not included in the point calculations, applicants must hold a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.4 or greater on a 4.0 scale.

Prerequisite Course Points: Completion of each pre-requisite course category that is completed by the end of the fall semester prior to the application deadline. An additional point for Completed prerequisites taken at CMC.

Dental Hygiene Quality Points: A grade point average (GPA) is calculated based on the student's academic achievement in select prerequisite courses. Biology and Nutrition courses receive more weight than other general education courses.

Casper: Casper is an online test which assesses characteristics that we believe are important for successful students and graduates of our program.

TEAS Test: All applicants must have the results of a current TEAS test in their application packet. The test must be taken within 8 months of the application deadline. Points are awarded based on the total composite score.

In-District/ Reapplying Applicants: We will recognize applicants:

- Who qualify for [in-district tuition](#) status
- Who have been an Alternate status in Dental Hygiene program in previous year's application process

Degrees/ Related Health Certificates: Points are awarded for compensated, (non-volunteer) work experience of 6 months or longer, under a current healthcare certification. We will recognize applicants:

- Who hold other degrees (AA, AS, AAS, BA, BS, etc.)
- Who hold a current health related certificate and who have worked 6 months or more in that field

Description: Confirm letter grade earned in each course, enter the respective quality point scale value.
